Proposed Organics Recycling Facility Relocation

The Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux Community (SMSC) is a federally recognized, sovereign Native American tribe in Scott County. Since 2011, the tribe has owned and operated an Organics Recycling Facility that collects and recycles organic waste in Shakopee. Transforming organic waste into compost materials and mulch helps restore fertile soils.

The SMSC is proposing to relocate its existing Organics Recycling Facility to a 93-acre industrial site near the intersection of highways 169 and 41 in

Louisville Township. The new facility's design will incorporate state-of-the-art technology and processes to greatly reduce odors and increase efficiency.

The proposed project is currently undergoing approvals, and it is anticipated the public comment period will begin in February for the Environmental Assessment Worksheet (EAW). If approved, the tribe anticipates starting construction in summer/fall of 2023 with a goal of being fully operational by spring/summer 2024.
